

# **Careers in Theatre**

our flagship Creative Learning programme for schools in Tower Hamlets and beyond.

The programme has been running for more than 20 years and is a multi-disciplinary introduction to theatre-making which provides participants with new skills and increases their practical knowledge of career options in the theatre industry. Through a hands-on project management style experience, participants learn about all the elements, artistic, technical and administrative, that go into creating a piece of professional theatre performance.

In the main, the programme works with Year 10 students who are just beginning their GCSE Drama course and offers a unique opportunity to bring a class together in a day of teambuilding which can continue to shape their collaborative practice throughout the rest of their two-year course.



## Phase 1:

a day-long programme which brings together around students, often from two or three different schools, in teams of five disciplines (acting, lighting, set design, sound and stage management) who use a script extract as a stimulus to work collaboratively to produce a fully staged performance by 5pm. More than 250 young people take part over five days.

# Phase 2:

one student from each school undertakes a one-week work experience placement at Half Moon including observing workshop activities in the local community. Half Moon also offers ten week, two-hour volunteering roles in our Youth Theatres for Tower Hamlet's students working towards their Duke of Edinburgh Awards or other volunteering schemes.







# Students' comments from Phase 1

I enjoyed having the freedom to create anything I wanted and making it.

I felt proud that in the short time we had, I and others were able to complete the set design to the best ability.

I learned that theatre is not all about acting. To make the performance outstanding, there's other areas needed to be complete otherwise the show will not go on.





I found the stage managing really enjoyable and I believe was the hardest job in the theatre as we liaised and made everything come together.

The thing I most enjoyed is the practicality of it all, the adrenalin to stay on schedule and for everyone there's an important role, so teamwork was really good.

I enjoyed mixing with another school and getting to know each other.

What would I change to make the day different? NOTHING!

What would I change to make the day different? STAYING LONGER!

## Teachers' comments from Phase 1

It has opened my eyes as a teacher and given me the confidence to explore the more technical aspects of theatre with my students. I feel more confident, they feel more confident.

CiT enables students to develop cross-curricular and interpersonal skills on a level that is impossible to deliver from one school alone. A fantastic day.

So fantastic for students to feel the heat/intensity of a technical rehearsal – something I cannot do in the classroom. Students treated like professionals and therefore really rose to the challenge.

Overall, the students learn more in a day at CiT than I can teach them in a year!

## Lighting

Experience of using lighting equipment: preparing a rig, operating the desk

#### Sound

Experience of using sound equipment: recording, sound design, editing

### Design

Developing creative set and props design ideas in 2D and 3D

As a team, building and painting scenic elements and choosing costumes for the performance

### **Stage Management**

Ensuring the smooth running of the rehearsal process

Liaising between the rehearsal room and technical and creative teams – gather, record and distribute production information and create props Ensuring the smooth running of technical rehearsals Running backstage and onstage during performances

## **Acting and Devising**

Practical experience of devising Experiencing an actor's approach to rehearsal Understanding ensemble working

**Phase 1:** one day in the autumn term (Thursday 12<sup>th</sup>, Friday 13<sup>th</sup>, Monday 16<sup>th</sup>, Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> and Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October, 9.15am – 5pm) at Half Moon to create a performance from scratch as an ensemble cast and crew, taking on roles in lighting, sound, design, stage management and acting **Phase 2:** throughout the year
