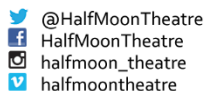

A thought-provoking collection of photographs and prints exploring the notion of home and the everyday journeys we make, which are often taken for granted.

Halfway Home contains striking observations of place and space by London-based artist Georgie Fay. Her work for this exhibition explores the notion of flight and the journeys made by migrating birds, using the current migrant crisis as a poignant point of reference.

Prints were created by combining traditional techniques of etchings with digital processes. Embroidery stitching, colour and dry felting has then been added to some of the work to create a patchwork of styles and reminiscences.

Photographs show significant landscapes and places that have been given a dreamlike quality by additional layers of imagery.

Georgie Fay is a participatory artist and printmaker. She runs workshops and activities responding to her practice with various participants in and around central London. Georgie will be running schools workshops at Half Moon as part of her residency.

Unframed bespoke prints in various colours are available for some of the artworks (those listed as frame-only); please ask a member of staff for more details. Greeting cards are also available to purchase at £2.70 each.
