At **St Paul's Way School**, students were encouraged to take a journey of curiosity about art, design and visual media in developing their work, fostering a desire to learn, research and experiment. Art, for the school, is a vital element of the curriculum and students are taught to explore and experiment with a wide range of artists' approaches and techniques to encourage their creativity. This approach nurtures visual literacy and critical thinking through exploring the world around them as part of their engagement with project themes.

At **Stepney All Saints School**, students have explored various themes that help them deepen and broaden their creative skills and knowledge. Art and Design Technology play a vital role in contributing to the holistic education of each student at the school, allowing them a space to explore, experiment, create, fail and succeed. Students are encouraged to explore their sense of self and place in the world, to foster a sense of empathy and develop critical analysis skills and we encourage them to develop curiosity and inquisitiveness.

Connections in Time is part of Half Moon's on-going commitment to showcase the work of local art students from across our home borough and to inspire more young people to see the creative industries as a fulfilling and exciting career choice.
